The Warning Passages in Hebrews

- The Purpose of the Warnings Why are they in the book of Hebrews?
- The People in the 1st Warning Who is the writer speaking to?

Not the CHRISTIAN.

Not those who have **<u>NEVER</u>** heard the gospel.

But those who are only **INTELLECTUALLY** convinced of the gospel.

LESSON - The Danger of Drifting From Salvation (2:1-4)

I. YOU SHOULD PAY CLOSE ATTENTION BECAUSE OF THE CHARACTER OF CHRIST v. 1

2 phrases to understand

"we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard ..."

"so that we do not *drift* away from it."

II. YOU SHOULD PAY CLOSE ATTENTION BECAUSE OF THE <u>CERTAINTY</u> OF JUDGMENT v. 2

2 words are used to describe sin

"every transgression ... received a just penalty" = To STEP across the line.

"every disobedience ... received a just penalty" = To **NEGLECT** to do something.

The principle - The more you <u>KNOW</u>, the greater the <u>CONDEMNATION</u>. (Matthew 11:20-24; Mark 12:38-40; Luke 12:47; Hebrews 10:28-29)

III. YOU SHOULD PAY CLOSE ATTENTION BECAUSE OF THE <u>CONFIRMATION</u> OF GOD vs. 3-4

2 witness of the Gospel

"... it was at the first spoken through the Lord," = The <u>SAVIOR</u>. v. 3a

".... It was *confirmed* by those who heard, ... = The <u>APOSTLES</u>. vs. 3b-4
