
I. JESUS OUR "GREAT" HIGH PRIEST 4:14-16

Who is He?

His **PRIESTHOOD**, v. 14

- See 1:3; 2:17; 3:1

- Chapters 5-9 focus almost **EXCLUSIVELY** on Jesus' high priesthood.
- In 4:14 Jesus is called a **GREAT** high priest.



Jesus has "passed through the heavens ..." (Cf. 2 Corinthians 12:2-4)

So "let us hold fast our confession."

Some application points ...

- 1) There is no need for a **JEWISH** or **RITUALISTIC** priesthood or sacrifice since Christ became our great high priest.
- 2) To not completely trust in Christ as our great high priest implies that the final and perfect atonement for sin has not been **MADE**, which is an **AFFRONT** to God.
