II. A Better Priesthood: Christ and Melchizedek (7-10)

${\sf INTRODUCTION-Jesus}$ the Superior Priest

• 1^{ST} ... The Ministry - Of the Priesthood in Hebrews 5-10

2ND ... The Man - Melchizedek the Priest in Hebrews 5-7

Mentioned 1^{st} in chapter 5 = 3 times (vs. 6,10,11)

Mentioned next in chapter 6 = 1 time (v. 20)

Mentioned final in chapter 7 = 5 + 10,11,15,17

Note ... The goal is to get us to 7:25 "Therefore He is ..."

"... able also to save forever,"

"... those who draw near to God through Him,"

"... since He always lives to make intercession for them."

I. THE PRESENTATION OF MELCHIZEDEK'S/JESUS' SUPERIORITY - WHO IS THIS GUY? vs. 1-3

The Suggestions

He is an ANGEL — That can't be true based on Hebrews 5:1

He is the PRE - INCARNATE Jesus — That can't be true based on Hebrews 7:3

The Truth — He is a <u>HISTORIC</u> human being; whose priestly ministry <u>ILLUSTRATES</u> the priestly ministry of Jesus Christ.

Genesis 14:18

Psalm 110:4

Hebrews 5:6,10; 6:20; 7:1,10,11,15,17

The Text vs. 1-3

5 ways Melchizedek (and Jesus) are Superior Priests

- 1) It was a **ROYAL** priesthood. "... king of Salem." v. 1
- 2) It was **UNIVERSAL**, not **NATIONAL** (Jewish). "priest of the Most High God." v. 1
- 3) It provided <u>RIGHTEOUSNESS</u> and <u>PEACE</u>. "by the translation of his name, king of righteousness, and ... king of Salem, which is peace." v. 2
- 4) It was <u>PERSONAL</u>, not <u>HEREDITARY</u>. "without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life." v. 3
- 5) It was <u>ETERNAL</u>, not <u>TEMPORARY</u>. "... made like the Son of God, he remains a priest perpetually." v. 3
