What we are going to learn today in our study ...

- 8:1 "Now the main point in what has been said is this:"
 - 1) Jesus has taken His <u>SEAT</u>. v. 1

"... we have such a high priest, **who has taken His seat** at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty **in the heavens**, ..."

Question — Where is heaven?

Question — How can Jesus be seated if Acts 7:55 says Stephen saw him "standing?"

When it says that Jesus is seated, it is because He rests from His finished work of <u>REDEMPTION</u>. (Hebrews 8:1)

When it says that Jesus was standing, it was because one of His own had fallen into trouble, and His is standing to take <u>ACTION</u>. (Acts 7:55)

2) Jesus has entered the true **SANCTUARY**. vs. 2-5

v. 2 — The earthly tabernacle was a shadow or reflection of God's "<u>TRUE</u> tabernacle" in heaven.

v. 3 — Both "GIFTS" and "SACRIFICES" are offered by all priests.

vs. 4-5 — If the priesthood of Jesus had been connected to the earthly tabernacle, then Jesus could "NOT be a priest at <u>ALL</u>."

LESSON - What Makes the New Covenant Better?, Part 1 8:1-13

I. IT IS A BETTER COVENANT v.6

"But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, by as much as He is also the **mediator** of a **better covenant**, which has been enacted on **better promises**."

II. IT HAS BETTER BENEFITS vs. 7-13

The Problem with the Old Covenant v. 7

"For if that first covenant **had been faultless**, there would have been no occasion sought for a second."

The Promises of the New Covenant vs. 8-13 (Jeremiah 31)

1) It was written by <u>GOD</u> v. 8

"Behold, days are coming, says the Lord, when I will effect a new covenant ..."
