### What we are going to learn today in our study ...

Hebrews 9:15-28

The theme of redemption, by blood, is pervasive in the Bible

- The death angel passed through Egypt and **SPARED** those who applied the blood (Exodus 11:4-6).
- The blood of Christ **SAVES** those who believe (Romans 3:25).

An inheritance, by the blood of Christ, through a last will and testament (Hebrews 9:15-28)

- Romans 8:16-17 *"heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ"*
- Ephesians 1:11-17 *"We have obtained an inheritance"*
- 1 Corinthians 3:22-23 *"all things belong to you, and you belong to Christ; and Christ belongs to God."*

I. THE PURPOSE OF THE NEW COVENANT/WILL vs. 15-17

The Transition v. 15 } The key verse summarizing vs. 1-14

The Terms vs. 16-17 } The making of a will

"covenant" (NASB)	"will" (ESV)	"testament" (KJV)
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- 1) "covenants" are made between **LIVING** people.
- 2) "wills" or "testaments" don't go into effect until someone **DIES**.

A lesson from Genesis 15:9-18

Why the cutting of the animals?

Why didn't Abraham walk through the covenant pieces?

The Point of Hebrews 9:15-17 — In order for the New Covenant (Will or Testament) to be of any benefit to you, it was **NECESSARY** for Christ to die.

II. THE PROMISES OF THE NEW COVENANT/WILL vs. 18-28

"Therefore ..."

We have total **FORGIVENESS** by Christ's blood. (vs. 18-26)

"blood" — 7x's (vs. 18,19,20,21,22,25)

"Christ has entered, ... heaven itself, now to **appear** in the presence of God **on our behalf**." v. 24

"... He has **appeared** once for all at the end of the ages **to put away sin** by the sacrifice of Himself." v. 26

**Today's Growth Point — How does this passage apply to you today?**

- 1) To refuse Christ is to turn your back on the **ONE** place sin can be **FORGIVEN**.
- 2) God's love for His people has never **BEGAN** and will never **END**.
