## LESSON - When God Chooses Not To Remember 10:1-18

### I. THE FORESHADOWING IN THE O.T. — It Points to The Real Sacrifice vs. 1-4

#### The Failures of the Old Sacrifices

They could never bring **ACCESS** to God. v. 1

*"For the Law ... **can never**, by the same sacrifices which they offer continually year by year, **make perfect** those who draw near."*

They could never **REMOVE** sin. vs. 2-3

*"... would no longer **have had consciousness** of sin ... But in those sacrifices **there is a reminder** of sins year by year."*

They could only deal with the **EXTERNAL**. v. 4

*"For it is **impossible** for the blood of bulls and goats to **take away sins**."*

### II. THE FULFILLMENT IN THE N.T. — Jesus is the Real Sacrifice vs. 5-14

#### The Effectiveness of the New Sacrifice

It **REFLECTS** God's eternal will. vs. 5-10

*"Sacrifices and offering **You have not desired** ... In whole burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin **You have taken no pleasure** ... But a body you have **prepared** for Me ... Behold, I have come to do **Your will**, O God."*

Verses 5-7 are a quote from Psalm 40:6-8

It **REMOVES** all sin. vs. 11-13

*"Every priest **stands daily** ... but He, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, **sat down** at the right hand of God, ..."*

It **RESTORES** us to perfection. v. 14

*"For by one offering He **has perfected** for all time those who are (being) sanctified."*

#### **Today's Growth Point — How does this passage apply to you today?**

vs. 15-18 *"And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us; ... **I will put my laws upon their hearts** ... He then says ... Their sins and their lawless deeds **I will remember no more**."*

verses 15-16 are a quote from Jeremiah 31:33-34

1) It **RENEWS** you to love God from the inside out (regeneration). v. 16

2) It **RELEASES** you from guilt and condemnation (justification). v. 17
