- The Theme of the Book Jesus is "Better" ...
- The Outline of the Book of Hebrews ...
 - A Better Person: Jesus (1-6)
 - 1) Jesus is better than all the O.T. Prophets
 - 2) Jesus is better than Angels
 - 3) Jesus is better than Moses
 - 4) Jesus is better than Aaron's Priesthood

A Better Priesthood: Jesus (7-10)

- 1) Because Jesus is a priest like Melchizedek chp. 7
- 2) Because Jesus provides a better covenant chp. 8
- 3) Because only Jesus cleanses our dirty conscience chps. 9-10

What Cleanses Our Conscience?

We have total <u>FORGIVENESS</u> by Christ's blood. (9:18-26) We have complete <u>SALVATION</u> at the return of Christ. (9:27-28) God chooses to **FORGET** our sin (10:1-18)

The Connection — 10:19 "Therefore ..."

The Challenges — 10:22-25 (3 Exhortations/Encouragements) "Let us ..."

Note ... These 3 exhortations in verses 22-25 (faith, hope, love) are an **INTRODUCTION** to the rest of the book of Hebrews (chapters 11-13).

I. First — "Let us draw near to God ..." 10:19-22

Our Confession (The Mandate) — "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering"

Our Confidence (The Motivation) — "... for He who promised is faithful;"

III. THIRD - LET US HOLD ON TO ONE ANOTHER vs. 24-25

The Requirements (The Mandates) -3 Things

"how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds" v. 24

"not forsaking our own assembly together, as is the habit of some, ..." v. 25a

"... but encouraging one another; ..." v. 25b

The Applications ... (What is this telling us to do?)

The Reason (The Motive) — "and all the more as you see the day drawing near."
