#### What Cleanses Our Conscience?

We have total <u>FORGIVENESS</u> by Christ's blood. (9:18-26) We have complete <u>SALVATION</u> at the return of Christ. (9:27-28) God chooses to <u>FORGET</u> our sin (10:1-18)

"Let us draw near to God ..." 10:22

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering..." 10:23

"Let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds" 10:24

### LESSON - What Happens If We Keep On Sinning? 10:26-31

#### I. APOSTASY — What Is It?

Generally, apostasy is an **INTENTIONAL** falling away or withdrawal, a defection.

Deuteronomy 13:13 1 Samuel 15:11 2 Chronicles 25:14-15,27

Specifically, apostasy is an intentional falling away or withdrawal, a defection from <u>CHRIST</u> and the <u>GOSPEL</u>.

1 John 2:19 2 Thessalonians 2:3 1 Timothy 4:1-2

The classic example is **JUDAS ISCARIOT**.

#### II. APOSTASY — Who Does This Passage In Hebrews 10 Refer To?

The Characteristics v. 26a

1) The Truth about Christ is <u>KNOWN</u> and <u>RECOGNIZED</u>.

"For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, ..."

2) The Truth about Christ is **<u>REJECTED</u>**.

"For if we **go on sinning willfully** after receiving the knowledge of the truth, ..."

Note — This is referring to an UNBELIEVER.

Note — Every apostate is an <u>UNBELIEVER</u>, but not every unbeliever is an <u>APOSTATE</u>.

The Consequences vs. 26b-29

- 1) They will have no **PAYMENT** for their sin v. 26b "there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins."
- 2) There will receive GREATER judgment. vs. 27-29
  - The Example Under Moses (Law) v. 28
  - The Example Under the Gospel (Grace) v. 29

They have rejected the **FATHER**. "trampled under foot the Son of God."

They have rejected the <u>SON</u>. "regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant, by which he was sanctified."

They have rejected the HOLY SPIRIT. "and has insulted the Spirit of grace."
