Hebrews 12:1-2

The Pictures (metaphors) — How does the Bible describe the Christian Life? (2 Timothy 2)

- A <u>SOLDIER</u> v.3 (cf. Ephesians 6 "Put on the armor of God")
- An <u>ATHLETE</u> v. 5
- A <u>FARMER</u> v. 6

Note - There are 2 kinds of athletes:

- 1) A **BOXER** in a ring
- 2) A <u>RUNNER</u> in a race

1 Corinthians 9:24-27 1 Timothy 6:11-12 2 Timothy 2:5, 4:7

The Plea – What is the main focus of Hebrews 12:1-2?

"Let us run ..."

LESSON - Run the Race Looking Unto Jesus 12:1-2

I. THE EVENT (An Analogy) v. 1

The Crowd — "Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surround us, ..."

"witnesses" is used in 2 ways

- 1) As an **OBSERVER**.
- 2) As a **TESTIMONY**.

The Challenges — "Let us ..."

"Also lay aside every encumbrance/every weight" — Things that may not be sinful, but <u>DULL</u> your spiritual senses or <u>DECREASE</u> your ability to run after holiness.

At this point you ask: Will this HELP me run the race?

"... and the sin which so easily entangles us/clings so closely ..." — Things that are sinful and require DISOBEDIENCE to God's clear Word.

At this point you ask: Will this <u>HOLD</u> me down in the race?

The Command

"... and let us run with **endurance** the race that is set before us."

II. THE EXAMPLE (Jesus) v. 2

We are told to LOOK to Jesus who is "the author/founder and perfecter of faith,..."

We are told to <u>LEARN</u> to understand and endure suffering as God's loving discipline "who for the joy set before Him **endured** the cross, **despising** the shame, and has **sat down** at the right hand of the throne of God."

How Do We Fix Our Eyes on Jesus?

- 1. By <u>**READ</u>** the Word (Psalm 119)</u>
- 2. By PRAY the Word (John 15:1-7)
- 3. By **SING** the Word (150 Psalms, Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16)
