Hebrews 12:25-29

There is a sense of <u>URGENCY</u> in this passage.

"See to it that you do not refuse Him who is speaking ..." v. 25

"... **let us** show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe;" v. 28

There is a sense of the UNIQUENESS of God in this passage. "for our God is a consuming fire." v. 29

I. GOD SPEAKS - What It Sounds Like vs. 25-27

The Setting – v. 25

A Contrast between Mount Sinai & Mount Zion (cf. 12:18-24)

God has spoken on earth v. 25a "... who warned them on earth" (Mount Sinai)

God has spoken from heaven v. 25b "... who warned them from heaven" (Mount Zion)

The Point ... This is a voice of **WARNING**.

The Sound - v. 26

"And His voice shook the earth then, ..."

"But now He has promised, saying, yet once more I will shake **not only the earth**, but **also the heaven**."

The Seriousness - v. 27

"This expression, 'Yet once more,' denotes the removing of those things which can be shaken, as of created things, so that those things which cannot be shaken may remain."

II. GOD SPEAKS - How We Should Respond vs. 28-29

The Response -v.28

"Therefore, ... let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe;"

The Point — Our response to God can and should be both <u>HUMBLE</u> and <u>HAPPY</u>.

The Reason — v. 29

"*Our God is a consuming fire*" (cf. Deuteronomy 4:24)

"God's jealousy is not a compound of frustration, envy, and spite, as human jealousy so often is, but appears instead as a . . . praiseworthy zeal to preserve something supremely precious"
