5 Priorities to Keep in Your Christian Life vs. 1-14

I. PRIORITY #1 — Loving and caring for our brothers and sisters in need (vs. 1-3)

The Application — Love is expressed by  $\underline{\text{DEEDS}}$  to strangers and sufferers.

II. PRIORITY #2 — Honor marriage as the most important human relationship on earth (v. 4)

The Application — Marriage is elevated by our <u>DEVOTION</u> to one another.

III. PRIORITY #3 — Don't fall in love with money (vs. 5-6)

The Application — Contentment is evidenced by confident <u>DELIGHT</u> in God Himself.

IV. PRIORITY #4 — Follow the Example of Your Leadership's Faith (v. 7)

The People — "Remember those who led you, who spoke the Word of God to you; ..."

The Purpose — "... and considering the result of their conduct, imitate their faith."

**The Application** — An imitating faith exposes our **DESIRE** for Christ & God's Word.

V. PRIORITY #5 — Devote Yourself to Christ No Matter What Else is Taught in the Culture or What it Costs (vs. 8-14)

"Jesus Christ is the same **yesterday** (the <u>PAST</u>) and **today** (the <u>PRESENT</u>)
and **forever** (the <u>FUTURE</u>)."

The Term — Understanding the Concept of Immutability in v. 8 (cf. Psalm 90:2, 102:25-27; Malachi 3:6; James 1:17)

- 1. It does not mean Jesus has never changed in His <u>ACTIONS</u>.
- 2. It means Jesus in His ATTRIBUTES as God has never changed. (Cf. Hebrews 1:10-12)

The Text — Understanding the Connection of v. 8 with verses 9-14

v. 9 "Do not be carried away by varied and strange teachings; for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by foods, through which those who were so occupied were not benefited."

Grace is more than a <u>PRINCIPLE</u>: It is a <u>POWER!</u> (cf. James 4:6; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 13:25)

Grace is a <u>PORTRAIT</u> of all that God has done for us in Christ in the New Covenant (See vs. 10-11)

- v. 10 "We have an altar from which those who serve the tabernacle (tent) have no right to eat."
- v. 11 "For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy place ... as an offering for sin, are burned outside the camp."

vs. 12-14 "Therefore Jesus also, ... suffered outside the gate. So, let us go out to Him outside the camp, .... For there we do not have a lasting city, but we are seeking the city which is to come."

The Truth — Understanding the Concept of Devotion (For these Hebrews and Ourselves)

The Application — Devotion to Christ explains our **DREAMS** about our future.
