God Speaks to Job — Chapters 38:1-41:34

"Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind and said, ..."

- **The 1**st **Message** The Importance of the Doctrine of Creation (Chapter 38:1-40:2)
- **The 2**nd **Message** The Importance of the Doctrine of God's Power & Providence (Chapters 40:6-41:34)

Job Responds to God — Chapters 40:3-5; 42:1-6

"Then Job answered the Lord and said, ..."

INTRODUCTION — Life is not a fairy tale!

The Point — "Happily ever after" needs to leave room for the **REALITIES** of life.

The Perspective — James' conclusion about Job (James 5:11)

"We count those blessed who endured. You have heard of the **endurance of Job** and have seen the outcome of the Lord's dealings, that **the Lord is full of compassion** and is **merciful**."

LESSON — *Almost* Happily Ever After 42:7-17

I. GOD'S VIEW OF JOB'S FRIENDS/FAMILY 42:7-9, 11

The Friends vs. 7-8

"... you have not spoken of Me what is right as My servant Job has."

God's Evaluation — "My servant Job" (cf. vs. 7,8)

God's Exhortations (vs. 8,9)

To His Friends - "... take for yourselves ... and go to My servant Job, and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves. So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite, went and did as the Lord told them;"

To Job - "My servant **Job will pray for you** ..."

The Family v. 11

"<u>Then</u> all his brothers and all his sisters and all who had known him before <u>came to him</u>, ..."

II. GOD'S VIEW OF JOB'S FORTUNES 42:10-17

"The **Lord restored** the fortunes of Job **the Lord increased** all that Job had **twofold**."

God restores Job's larger **FRIENDS** circle. v. 11 "...And each one gave him one piece of money, and each a ring of gold."

God restores Job's **FINANCIAL** security. v. 12 "... and he had 14,000 sheep and 6,000 camels, and 1,000 yoke of oxen and 1,000 female donkeys."

God restores Job's immediate <u>FAMILY</u> circle. vs. 13-15 "He had seven sons and three daughters. He named the first and their father gave them inheritance among their brothers."

Conclusion (vs. 16-17)

"After this, **Job lived** 140 years,.... And **Job died**, an old man and full of days."

The Story of Job prepares us for the story of **JESUS!**
