1 John 1:5-10 11/25/18

REVIEW — Let's remember what we have learned ...

The Topic — Fellowship (i.e. we have "eternal life") 1:1-4

It is connected with a **PERSON** vs. 1-3

It is designed with a **PURPOSE** v. 4

The Tests — Evidences of fellowship with God and one another

There is a **DOCTRINAL** test — "if we **say** ..." (what we believe)

There is an **OBEDIENCE** test — "if we **walk** in the light ..." (how we live)

There is a **RELATIONAL** test — "If we **love one another** ..." (how we relate to one another)

INTRODUCTION — How can I believe what anyone says?

LESSON — Test #1 — Walking In The Light 1:5-10

I. THE FOCUS — Who Is John Talking To?

"If **we** say ..." vs. 6,8,9,10

The Perspective

Is John describing two **TYPES** of Christians — those "in" or "out" of fellowship with God?

Is John describing a **GENUINE** Christian — fellowship is a synonymous word for saved?

vs. 1-5 — "We", is used 8x in these verses, and refers to the **APOSTLES**.

vs. 6-10 — "We", is used 12x in these verses, and refers generally to $\underline{\textbf{ANYONE}}$ who professes to be a Christian.

II. THE FEATURE — Walking In The Light vs. 5-10

The Message — "God is **Light**, and in Him is **no darkness** at all."

The Marks — How do I know if I am saved?

1) If you walk in the light (i.e. saved) you **LIVE** differently. vs. 6-7

Exposing the unbeliever — v. 6 (cf. 2:4,9) ... They consistently and characteristically **DISOBEY** God.

Note: They believe they are not **ACCOUNTABLE** for their sin/behavior.

Confirming the believer -v.7... They are not sinless, but they <u>SIN LESS</u>.

2) If you walk in the light (i.e. saved) you view **SIN** differently. vs. 8-10

Exposing the unbeliever — vs. 8,10 ... They don't think they are **GUILTY** and need forgiveness.

Note:

They can believe, on the one hand, they are not that ${\color{red} {\bf BAD}}.$

They can believe, on the other hand, they are a sinner and they need to **FIX** it.

Confirming the believer -v. 9 ... They know that before God they have a **DEBT** that needs forgiven, and a **STAIN** that needs removed and only God can do this.

Conclusion — How do I know if I'm saved?

Non-Christian	Christian
You say you know God, but you live in DISOBEDIENCE to God and His Word. v. 6	• You seek to CONTINUE in the light and are assured you are clean by Christ's blood. v. 7
 You <u>DENY</u> you are sinner. v. 8 You <u>DISREGARD</u> your sinful behavior. v. 10 	• You CONFESS (past and present) your guilt and sin and look to God alone for forgiveness. v. 9
