*“By this we **know** ...”*

1. There is a kind of knowing by means of **DISCOVERY**. (vs. 2, 20b)
2. There is a kind of knowing by means of **DISCLOSURE**. (vs. 13, 15, 18,19, 20a)

I. THE PRAYER GOD ALWAYS HEARS vs. 13-15

“These things **I have written to you** who believe in the name of the Son of God, **so that you may know** that you have **eternal life**.”

The Promise God Has Made — Assurance of Eternal Life (v. 13)

Eternal life is not just a **QUANTITY** of life, but a **QUALITY** of life. (John 17:3)

Eternal life is not just about a **PERIOD** of time; it's a **PERSON** (1 John 5:20)

Things True of Eternal Life

- 1) It begins **NOW** (Matthew 19:16; John 3:15, 5:24)
- 2) It is a **GIFT** to those who believe. (John 10:28; Romans 6:23; 1 John 2:25, 5:11)
- 3) It is never **REPEATED**. (John 3:14-15, 4:13-14, 6:27,51)

The Prayer God Always Hears — Alignment with God's Will (vs. 14-15)

*“This is the **confidence** which we have before Him, that, if we **ask** anything **according to His will**, He hears us ... **we know that we have the requests** which we have asked from Him.”*

Psalm 66:18

1 Peter 3:7

John 14:13, 15:7,16, 16:23

1 John 3:21-22

II. THE SIN GOD NEVER FORGIVES vs. 16-17

*“If anyone sees his brother committing a sin **not leading to death**, he shall **ask** and God **will for him give life** to those who commit sin not leading to death. There **is a sin leading to death**; I do not say that he should **make request** for this.”*
