REVIEW — The Transition from Moses to Joshua (The book of Exodus)

The Distinction — Moses & Joshua were different men

The Desires — Moses & Joshua were the same kind of men

The Development — How Joshua and the people knew Joshua was the right one

- The battle against Amalek (Exodus 17:8-16)
 - 1. Joshua begins to find his place as the new **WARRIOR LEADER**. (vs. 9-10a)
 - 2. Joshua learns that winning is **HARD**, victory is **DIFFICULT**. (vs. 10b-12)
 - 3. Joshua learns that Moses didn't try to be the **HERO**. (v. 13)
 - 4. Joshua learns that God determines **VICTORY** or **LOSSES**. (v. 14)
 - 5. Joshua learns that God is working out His **FUTURE** plans. (vs. 15-16)
- The Law at Mount Sinai (Exodus 24:12-18, 32:11-17, 25-32)
 - 6. Joshua learns the importance of removing <u>SIN</u> despite close relationships we may have. (vs. 25-29)
 - 7. Joshua learns the importance of <u>BROKENNESS</u> and <u>LOVE</u> for God's people. (vs. 30-32)

• The tent of meeting (Exodus 33:7-11, 26-30; Numbers 11:10-30)
8. Joshua learned the importance of a deepening RELATIONSHIP with God. (Exodus 33:7-11)
9. Joshua learned the importance seeing God's people fulfill their ROLES in ministry. (Numbers 11:10-30)
