

6 Steps to Spiritual Maturity (Part 1) Philippians 4:1-9

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INTRODUCTION — Why chapter 4?

The Context — Paul's Desire For Them (v. 1)

"Therefore, ... in this way stand firm in the Lord, ..."

Paul desires for them to be **STABLE** in their Christian life.

The Compassion ... Paul's Delight In Them (v. 1)

"my beloved brethren"

"whom I long to see"

"my joy"

"and crown"

"my beloved"

Paul knows that people will always respond more readily to exhortation if they are preceded by godly **ENCOURAGEMENT**.

LESSON – 6 Steps to Spiritual Maturity, Part 1 (4:1-9)

I. **CULTIVATE** HARMONY AMONG YOURSELVES vs. 2-3

"I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to live in harmony in the Lord."

■ The Problem — What is going on?

■ The Plea — What should they do?

II. CONTINUE IN A SPIRIT OF JOY v. 4

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!"

- Our Circumstances What makes us happy?
- The Command What should make us happy?

III. CONCENTRATE ON THE LORD'S PRESENCE v. 5

"Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near."

- The Meaning What is a gentle spirit?
- The Means How can we remember the Lord is near?

Habakkuk shows us the way (1:2-11; 3:16)

1. He remembers that God is **ETERNAL**. 1:12a

"Are you not from everlasting, ..."

2. He remembers that God is **SELF-EXISTENT**. 1:12b

"... O Lord, my God, ..."

3. He remembers that God is **HOLY**. 1:12c

" ... my Holy One ..."

4. He remembers that God is **FAITHFUL**. 1:12d

"We will not die."

5. He remembers that God is **SOVEREIGN**. 1:12e

"You, O Lord, have appointed them to judge; And You, O Rock, have appointed them to judge."
