Lesson – Us & Them

I. HOW JOHN SAW IT – His Perspective (v. 38)

The Person – "John said to Him,"

The Perspective — "... *Teacher* (called *Master* in Luke 9:49) *we saw someone casting out demons in Your name,* ..."

The Prohibition – "... and we **tried to prevent him** ..."

The Problem — "... *because* he was not following us."

The Principle (vs. 39-40)

"But Jesus said, "Do not hinder him, <u>for</u> there is no one **who will perform a miracle in My name**, and be able soon afterward t**o speak evil** of Me. <u>For</u> **he who is not against us is for us**."

The Picture (v. 41)
