I. God's Word Is Sufficient

A. What is the sufficiency of Scripture? The sufficiency of Scripture means that all things necessary for <u>SALVATION</u> and for living the Christian life in <u>OBEDIENCE</u> to God and for his <u>GLORY</u> are given to us in the Scriptures

B. Hebrews 1:1-4 — A Series of Contrasts

- 4. A Contrast of **WAYS**
- All of these contrast point us to this conclusion: Jesus Christ is the <u>SUPERIOR</u> and <u>FINAL</u> agent of God's redemption and revelation

C. Why is the sufficiency of Scripture so important?

- 1. The sufficiency of Scripture allows us to keep **TRADITION** in its place
- 2. The sufficiency of Scriptures keeps us from <u>ADDING</u> to or <u>SUBTRACTING</u> from God's Word
- 3. The sufficiency of Scripture ensures the Word of God to be **RELEVANT** To all of life
- 4. The sufficiency of Scripture invites us to open our **BIBLES** to hear the voice of God to guide our lives
 - For our **EVANGELISM**
 - For our **COUNSELING**
 - For our **CHURCH GROWTH**
 - For our **CORPORATE WORSHIP**
 - For our **PERSONAL SPIRITUAL GROWTH**
