

How To Disagree on Matters of Conscience Romans 14:1-12

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I. What Is the <u>CONSCIENCE</u>?

- A. Things that the conscience can **BE**
 - The conscience can be <u>GOOD</u> in the sense of blameless, clear, clean, and pure (*Acts 23:1*; 24:16; 1 *Tim 1:5, 19; 3?9; Heb 13:18; 1 Peter 3:16-21*)
 - 2. The conscience can be **CLEANSED**, that is, cleared, perfected, purified, washed, purged, and sprinkled clean (*Heb 9:9, 14; 10:22*)
 - 3. Negatively, the conscience can be **WEAK** (1 Cor 8:7, 10, 12)
 - 4. The conscience can be **WOUNDED** (1 Cor 8:12)
 - 5. The conscience can be **DEFILED** (1 Cor 8:7; Titus 1:15)
 - 6. The conscience can be encouraged or emboldened to **SIN** (1 Cor 8:10)
 - 7. The conscience can be **EVIL** or **GUILTY** (*Heb 10:22*)
 - 8. And finally, the conscience can be **SEARED**, as with a hot iron (1 Tim 4:2)

- B. Things that the conscience can **BE**
 - 1. The conscience can **BEAR WITNESS** or **CONFIRM** (*Rom 2:15; 9:1; 2 Cor 1:12; 4:2; 5:11*)
 - 2. The conscience can **JUDGE** or try to determine another person's **FREEDOM** (1 Cor 10:29)
 - 3. And The conscience can lead one to **ACT** a certain way (*Rom 2:15; 13:5; 1 Cor 10:25-28*)
- C. <u>Definition</u>: The conscience is your consciousness of what you believe is right and wrong
 - 1. The conscience produces **DIFFERENT** results for people based on different moral standards
 - 2. The conscience can **CHANGE**
 - 3. The conscience functions as a **<u>GUIDE</u>**, monitor, witness, and judge

II. The Principle of Theological TRIAGE

- A. First level issues are most **<u>CENTRAL</u>** and **<u>ESSENTIAL</u>** to Christianity
- B. Second level issues create **REASONABLE BOUNDARIES** between Christians
- C. Third level issues are **DISPUTABLE** matters, or matters of **CONSCIENCE**
 - ☆ Disagreements on third-level issues should not be cause for DISUNITY within a local church family.

III.The CONTEXT of Romans 14

- A. Those with a strong conscience were tempted to **ARROGANCE**
- B. Those with a weak conscience were tempted to **JUDGMENTALISM**

IV.<u>12 Principles about How to Disagree with other Christians over Matters of</u> <u>Conscience</u>

A. **WELCOME** those who disagree with you (v.1-2)
